Blasting at operating limestone quarries in Miami-Dade County is conducted on an as needed basis to provide materials for construction activities. Typically, each operation blasts on an average of two to three times weekly, per mining area, depending on the size of the operation. Scheduling is set up by the mining operation in conjunction with the blasting contractor, providing for separation between blasts.

Blasting at association member operations is generally scheduled after 9:00 a.m. and prior to 3:30 p.m. Monday – Friday, but weather or other extenuating circumstances may require blasting after 3:30 P.M. No blasting is conducted on Saturday, Sunday or on legal holidays as is determined by the State of Florida. The following dates are typically observed:

2017 State of Florida Holiday Schedule

New Year's Day, January 2 - Observed.

Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., January 16.

Memorial Day, May 29 (last Monday in May)

Independence Day, July 4.

Labor Day, September 4

Columbus Day and Farmers' Day, (second Monday in October)

Veterans' Day, November 10 - Observed.

Thanksgiving Day – Thanksgiving Friday – November 23-24 (fourth Thursday in November)

Christmas Day, December 25.

In addition association members do not blast the last two weeks of the year.

A schedule of the days and locations of blasting is prepared one week prior to any blasting within the area. When blasting is scheduled at more than one location on the same day, blasts are separated by a minimum of 30 minutes. **Schedule changes may be required when mechanical breakdown of equipment occurs and the site cannot be prepared in time to blast on the scheduled day. Weather in South Florida may also delay or cause cancellation of blasting operations. Blasts will be delayed due to lightning, heavy rain, or when environmental conditions present an impact to a nearby neighbor or a hazard to the mining site.**
